



The Fact Family topic might seem confusing to younger children at first; especially when they encounter some of the problems with larger numbers. Once they learn to understand and identify numbers, they will gain the confidence to solve more simple fact family math. Parents can guide their young kids through the family haunted house worksheets and encourage them to complete the math exercises.



Teaching kids phonetic sounds is important if you wish to get their early childhood education right. Your children will progress from speaking short sentences into pronouncing words properly, learning to write and identify words, and finally reading words in books. Understanding phonetic sounds will help make pronouncing and reading words easier for them. Words that are spelled alike and sound similar will no longer pose a problem once your child learns how to distinguish between short and long sounds, and how they might appear in words.

To make their learning easier, they can pronounce the words aloud as they find the right ones which contain the given vowel sounds.
